2. LANGUAGES

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If you plan to use 2 or 3 languages, then for each language you will specify the language link and the language directory. The language directory must use the simple characters a-z, A-Z. No special characters are allowed.

For multiple language sites, the web generation process changes. First, generate the home directory and pages. When the *Generate* process completes, you will be prompted (red tabs) to change the entered data for the next language. For a site supporting 3 languages, you will generate with 3 *Generate* clicks, once for each language directory.

If you plan to have a single language site, then leave all fields on this tab blank. If you want a multilanguage site, then fill in the fields. The *Language Link* field becomes the link text visible on the website. The *Language Directory* field indicates the directory in the website structure where the files will reside. The language directory is generated automatically by WebD71.

The *Link Header* is the text which appears at the top of the associated page. When you are generating a multilanguage site, on each generation pass, you will update the text in each tab. If you selected english and german, on the first pass, you would enter english text for the link and link header. On the second pass, you would supply the german text. When entering the second language text, you will want to take advantage of shifting the keyboard text language through Windows Control Panel.

As you enter text, you should realize the tables will “flow” based on the length of the text. However, there are practical limits.

Three different pages are affected by the text entered here. Foremost is index.htm, which is the first page a customer will see. The *Introduction* text is the first brief paragraph description they will see. For example, for a wedding photographer, it could state that you have been doing wedding for over 10 years and outdoor weddings in black and white are your specialty. Or for a sports photographer, it could include the sports you cover, and your affiliated newspaper.

The *Event Date* and *Event Description* appear on the page listing the events you have covered. The site consistently uses the phrase event. Other terms or synonyms exist; assignment, wedding, outing, or game.

The *Service Description* and *Service Price* are column headings which show on the Services pages. Again there are other synonyms for services, which you may find more appropriate or appealing.

The text and heading are limited to colors. The background for the site and the background for the higher resolution images can be colors or a repeating image. If you want to use colors, then specify a *Background for Images* of *None*. Otherwise click the gif you wish to use.

The *Preview* button, pops up a simple representation of the site. Use it to get an idea of what it looks like. Once the site is generated, the /preview directory provides a much more accurate presentation of the site.

The *Default Colors* button resets the colors to default gray, black, and tan.

Optionally, you can generate a website which interfaces with PayPal. This gives your customers the option of paying you directly or via PayPal. PayPal accepts credit cards. Clicking *Activate PayPal interface*, builds the interface. The PayPal ID is obtained from the PayPal website, www.paypal.com. A limited number of PayPal payment buttons are available at the PayPal website, *Sell wizard*. Select a button, generate the HTML, and cut/paste the button link into *PayPal Button URL*.

12. TECHNICAL

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The website runs on a UNIX platform, using PERL scripting, and UNIX Sendmail. You will need to contact the technical staff at your web site host for the settings. The UNIX defaults are supplied to assist you with your questions to the technical staff of your website host.

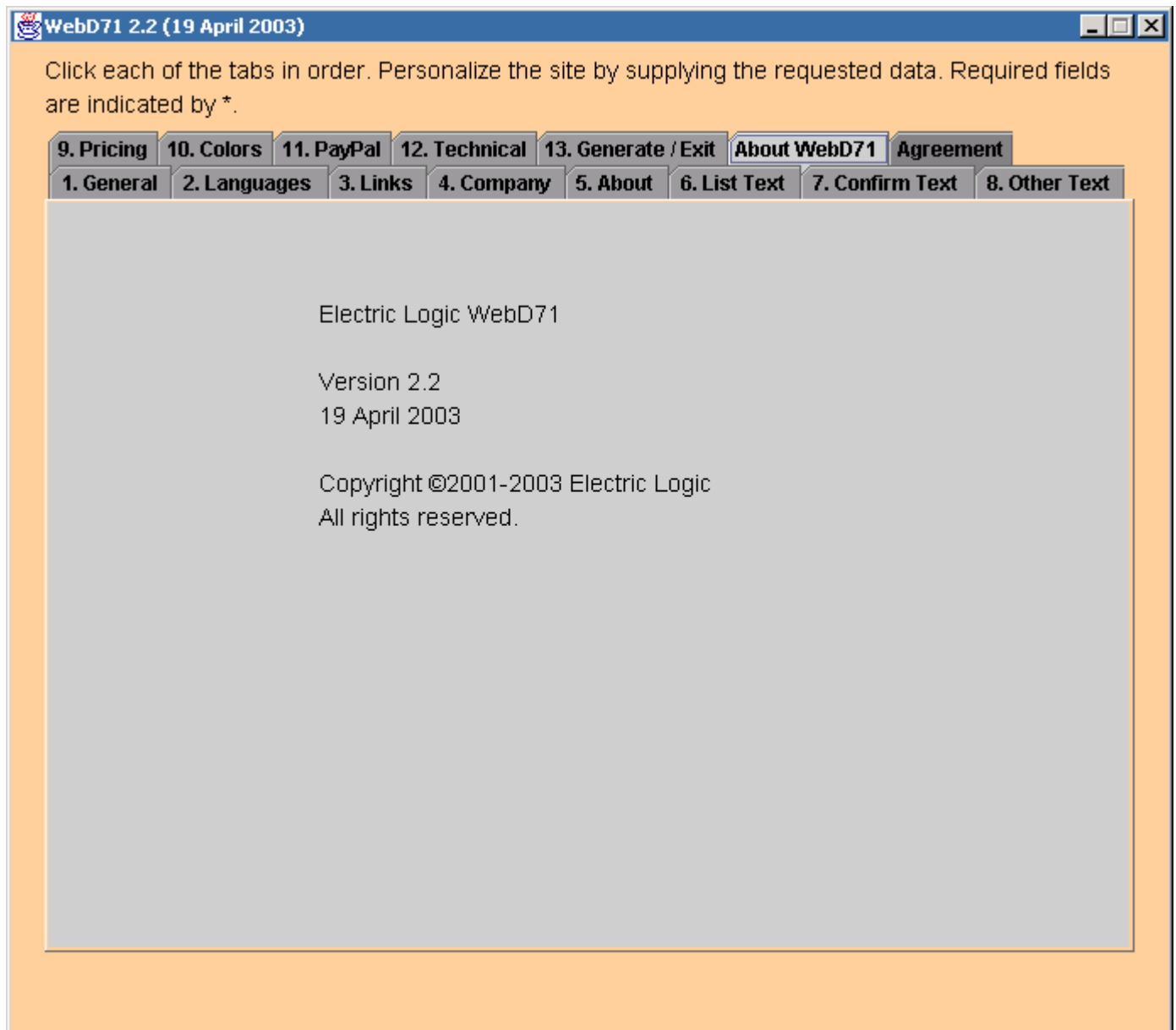
This page is activated once you have read and accepted the software agreement. If you do not understand and accept the agreement, then just exit. We are done.

The *Save* button validates the data you have supplied and saves it to a text file (.txt). In the standard edition of the product neither the input directory nor output directory can be changed. The input directory is always the product CD. The output directory is always c:\WebD71.

The *Generate* button uses the supplied data to generate a reviewable version of your ecommerce site (\preview directory) and a working version (\web directory). Before publishing your site from the \web directory, review it. It is possible and suggested

that with WebD71 running, you open the preview version of the website, \preview\index.htm. With both applications open, make changes in WebD71, Save, Generate, and then Refresh the page in your browser. Very shortly, you will arrive at settings that satisfy you.

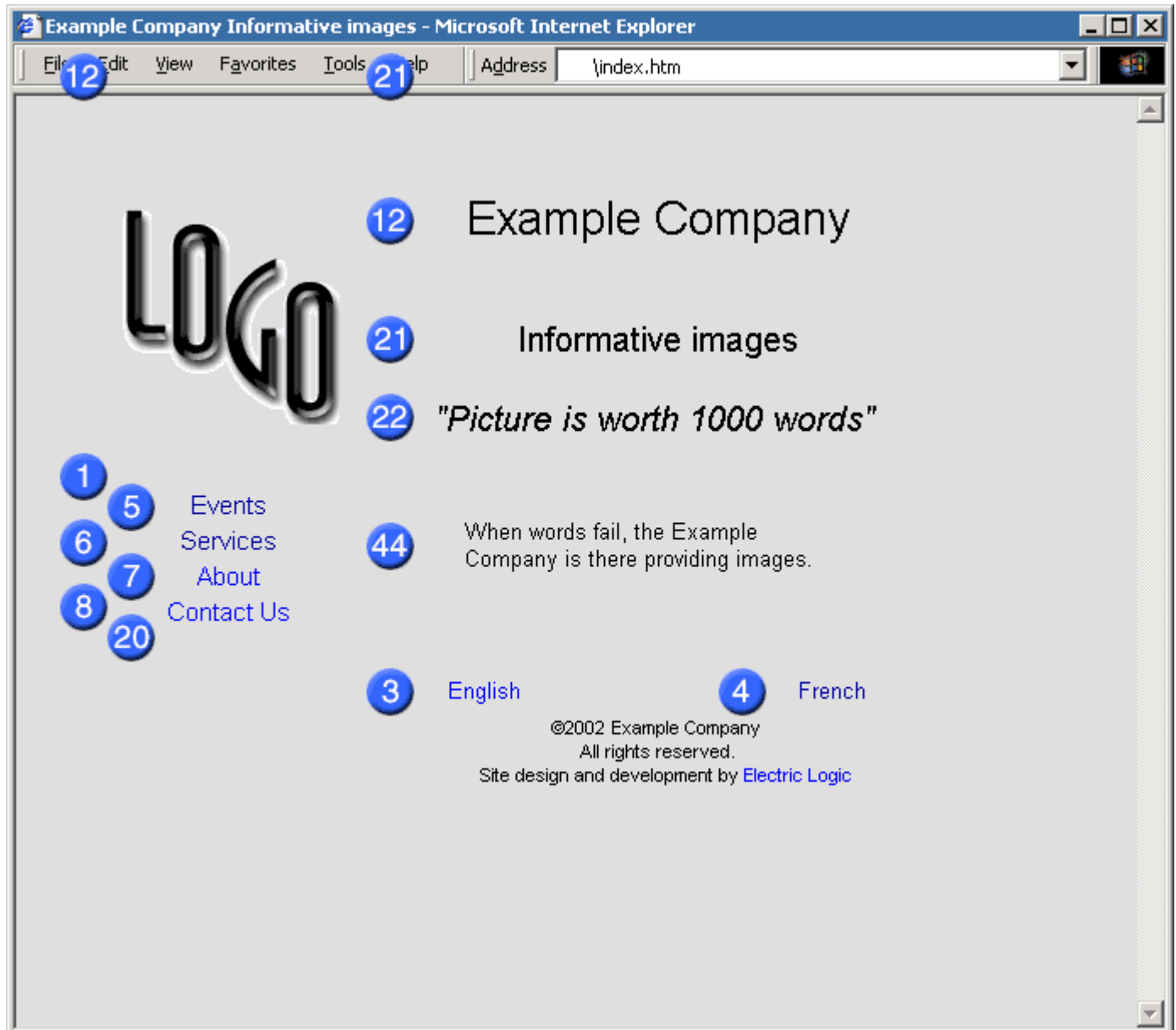

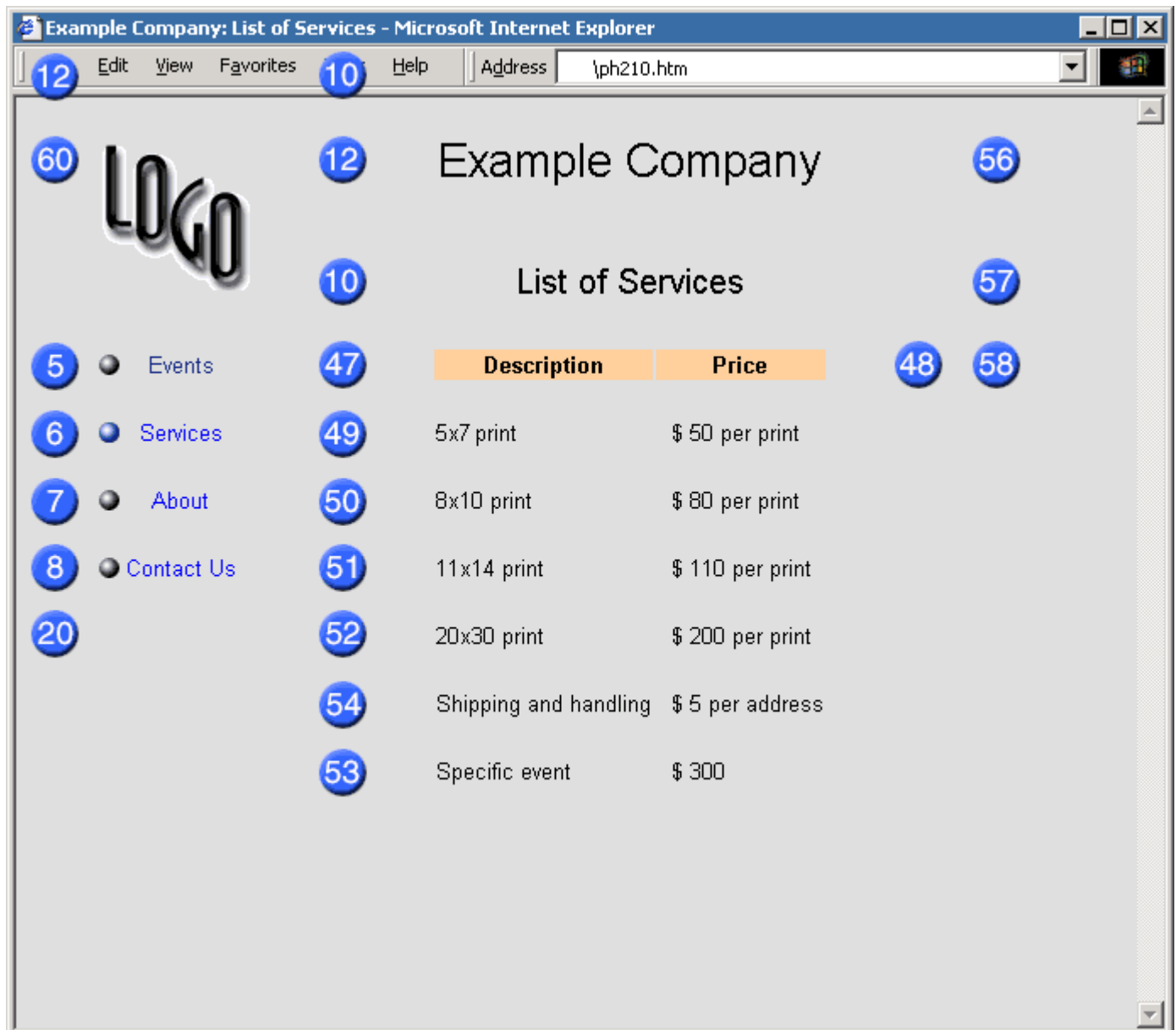
INDEX PAGE (INDEX.HTM)



The first page a customer sees when visiting your site. Index.htm is the default page presented by the webserver when a page is not specified. This sample shows you a page generated with multiple-languages. Index.html is also generated for you.

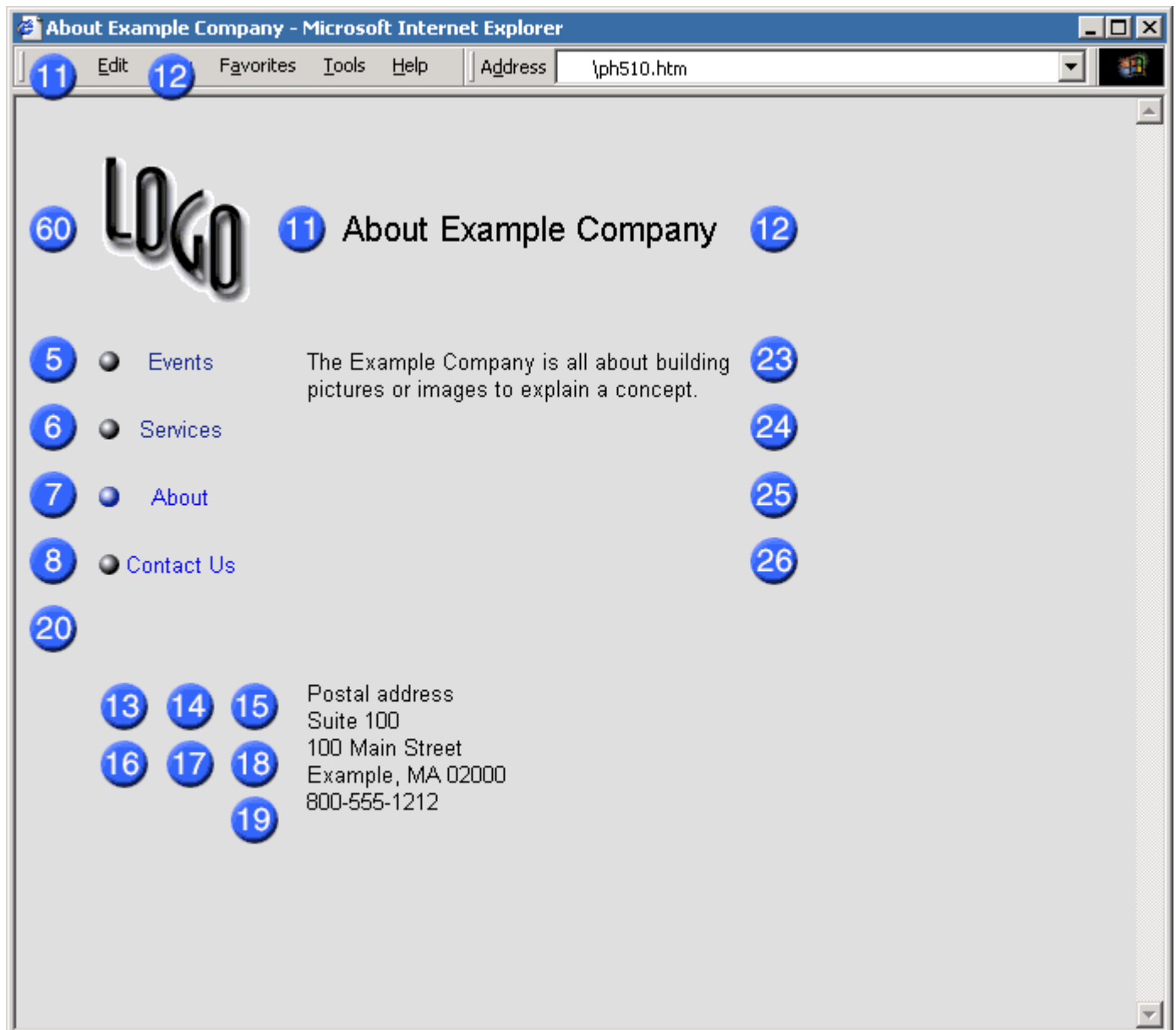
If your website host has *directory browsing* enabled, you would want to put index.html in each directory you have created. If *directory browsing* is disabled (the preferred situation) entering *your URL/info* should yield an HTTP Forbidden page.

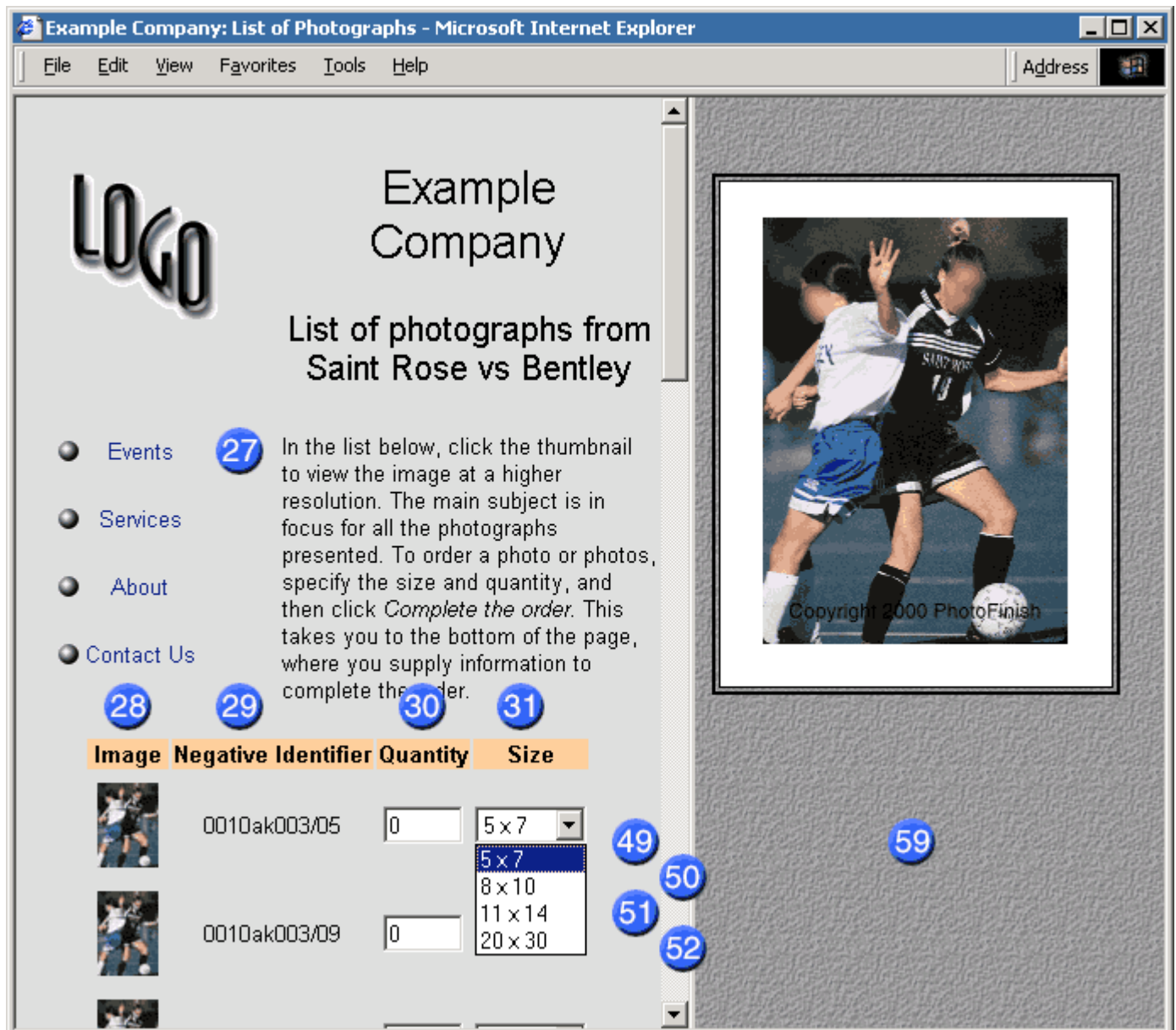

This page appears when you have chosen the *Events* navigation skeleton. For *PIN* and *BIB* navigation skeletons, this page is skipped. As stated earlier, it is important to realize the site is not restricted to Events. For a nature photographer this could be a list of the groupings which you sell. Example groupings are: Birds, Scenics, and B&W Flowers. This page is generated based on the information stored in the file *assign.txt*. See the section *Assign.txt File* which describes in detail the relationship between the data in *assign.txt* and the resulting HTML page.

LIST OF PHOTOGRAPHS PAGE (TOP) (EG100.CGI)



For *Events* and *PIN* navigation this page lists all the photographs for the event. For BIB navigation, those photographs matching the BIB number and those which have obscured BIB numbers (b_ prefix) are presented. From this page the customer, can view higher resolution images of selected photographs. Both vertical and horizontal format of higher resolution photograph are supported. The *Background for images* (59) can be different than the *Background for text*. The initial high resolution image presented resides in the /images directory and is named demo.jpg. This is the page used by the customer to place an order, as described on the next page.

The customer completes their order at the bottom of this page. Clicking *Submit the order* invokes JavaScript which validates the order. The validation checks that at least one photograph has been ordered, the customer's name, and the email address. In this example, the text area is used for *Comments* (37). As designed, in your return eMail to the customer, you request the customer's address. However, if you change the *Comments* label to *Address*, then this area could be used to collect the customer's address when the order is submitted. There is flexibility within the product and the site generated. My suggestion is to experiment. *Phone* (36) could be changed to *Urgent?*

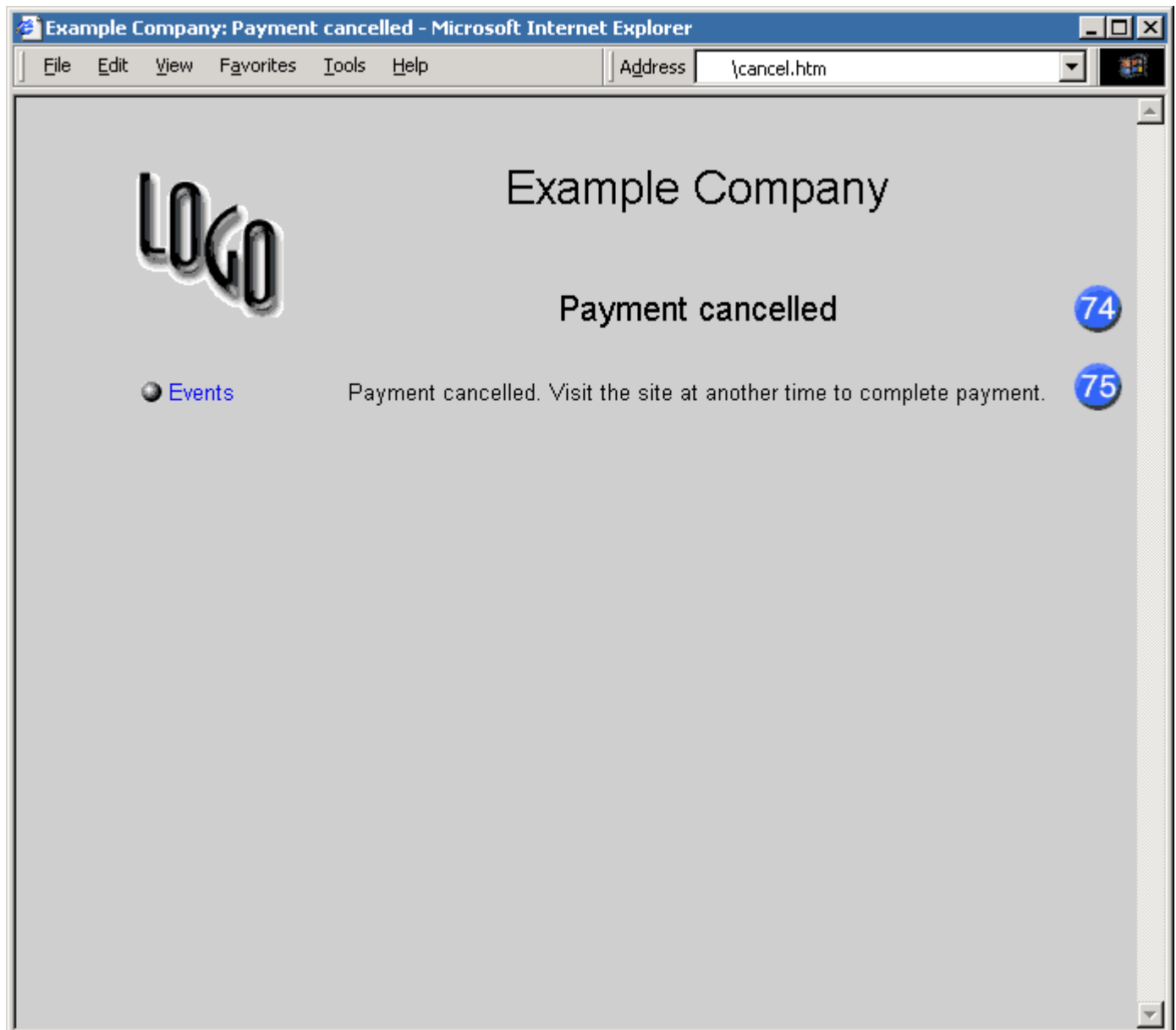
Clicking the View Details link, PayPal presents the customer with their complete order, using data from WebD71 generated pages. The PayPal interface is impressive.


